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Just a gentle reminder.... please, please stay in touch. Help us, Help you!

A month can be a long time.

Please let your nurse case manager know if anything comes up between your monthly visits.

We **<u>especially</u>** need to know right away of the following:

- Hospitalization
- ER visits
- Changes in address and/or telephone number



In the event of hospitalization and ER visits, we want to be there to support you.

Please share with your hospital staff that your loved one is on the Medically Fragile Program.


Please share your loved one's nurse case manager's name and number.

We want to help make sure you have everything you need at discharge, so it is a safe, smooth transition home.



In case of an Emergency call 911

Remember to report any suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation!



Lines are open 24/7. When you call the numbers above, you can remain anonymous and all the information is kept confidential.





Maintain Medicaid - <u>https://renew.hsd.nm.gov/</u>

In response to the COVID-19 public health emergency, the federal government did not require people to renew their Medicaid or SNAP.

Due to new federal laws and guidelines, everyone will now need to renew their Medicaid and SNAP eligibility when they are notified.

How to renew:

Make sure your contact info is correct. The New Mexico Human Services Department will need your current contact information to send your Medicaid renewal packet when it is time for you to renew. If you do not renew your eligibility, you will lose your Medicaid benefits.


Online tips:

- The fastest way to update contact information is through online chat.
- The fastest way to renew is online by signing in at <u>www.yes.state.nm.us</u>
- If you forgot your username or password, click Forgot User ID or Password and follow the instructions to reset.
- If you have previously signed in to yes.state.nm.us do not click the Create an Account button. This may result in a duplicate account, and you will need to call 1-800-283-4465 to update your account before you can renew online.
- If you do not see a renew button when you sign in at yes.state.nm.us, you will need to call 1-800-283-4465. Your account may need to be updated before you can renew online.

Important: If you previously qualified financially for Medicaid, but no longer qualify, or are at risk of losing Medicaid due to a change in financial status, please contact your Medically Fragile RN Case Manager. They can explore options available to maintaining your child's Medicaid.





America the Beautiful-The National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Access Pass

What is the America the Beautiful- The National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Access Pass?

The Interagency Access Pass is part of the America the Beautiful – The National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass series and is available free for US citizens or permanent residents with permanent disabilities.

Who is eligible to get an Interagency Access Pass?

The Interagency Access Pass may be issued to US citizens or permanent residents of any age that have been medically determined to have a permanent disability (does not have to be a 100% disability) that severely limits one or more major life activities.


