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
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
My daughter Quinn was diagnosed with Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) at 14 months old. Quinn was not meeting developmental milestones and her pediatrician was not too concerned. Having three older kids I knew in my gut something was not right. The only milestones Quinn had met by her first birthday were laborious sitting up and rolling. I called Early Intervention to evaluate Quinn after talking to my son's preschool teacher about the situation.

The physical therapist with Early Intervention immediately had concerns with Quinn and recommended that we see a neurologist as soon as possible. In the meantime, my husband hit the internet and researched the term hypotonia since the physical therapist told us Quinn had severe hypotonia. As we met with our pediatrician we brought up SMA and he was confident it wasn't SMA. We persistently asked the pediatrician to request approval from insurance to cover the blood test that could determine if Quinn had SMA. Thankfully our pediatrician listened to us, put in the request and insurance approved the blood test. In the meantime, we met with a very rude and condescending pediatric neurologist who didn't want to do any bloodwork, but rather a CT scan that was months out for an appointment. We asked if he thought she had SMA and he said no and that kids with SMA were very smart. Quinn was 13 months when he saw her and cognitively where she should be. We asked about SMA treatments which we had researched because we felt strongly that's what she had. His response was that it didn't matter if she received treatment at that moment or months later which could not have been further from the truth. As Quinn's neuromuscular doctor said, "time is neurons!" The sooner the better with treatment.

After Quinn was diagnosed with SMA through the blood test we knew immediately that we wanted her to receive Zolgensma, a gene therapy that had been FDA approved a few months prior to her diagnosis. Our insurance gave us some push back since the treatment was over 2 million dollars, but the neuromuscular doctor went to bat for us and ultimately insurance approved the therapy. Quinn received the therapy at 15 months almost exactly a month after being diagnosed with SMA. Zolgensma has stopped the progression of Quinn's SMA and she can crawl, stand and take several steps with her AFOs, uses a manual and power wheelchair, and just started kindergarten.

My husband and I learned at the beginning of Quinn's diagnosis that we have to be her biggest advocates. There were many times when we had to push and be persistent with doctors to get results and we're so grateful we did. We are also teaching Quinn to advocate for herself which we feel is equally important. Quinn has physical therapy and occupational therapy each week at Sandia Sunrise Therapies and we have learned the importance of a good team of therapists and doctors. We are so grateful for Quinn's therapists and the progress they have helped her make along with navigating mobility aids, school, and all the things that come with having a disability.

A little over a year ago we had a victory in New Mexico when they added SMA to the newborn screening panel. There are currently 3 FDA therapies for SMA and we could not be more grateful. Curesma.org is a great resource for more information. 



#### **Med Frag Families!**

Based on current COVID trends, masks will no longer be required by MFCMP staff for face to face visits beginning 7/10/23.

The exceptions are if families request the RN Case Manager to mask, then the RN Case Manager will mask during visits.

Also, if the RN Case Manager prefers to remain masked, they may do so at any time.

Due to our vulnerable population, we will continue to take necessary precautions, up to rescheduling the visit, if concerns for illness exist.

#### Maintain Medicaid - <a href="https://renew.hsd.nm.gov/">https://renew.hsd.nm.gov/</a>

In response to the COVID-19 public health emergency, the federal government did not require people to renew their Medicaid or SNAP.

Due to new federal laws and guidelines, everyone will now need to renew their Medicaid and SNAP eligibility when they are notified.

#### How to renew:

Make sure your contact info is correct. The New Mexico Human Services Department will need your current contact information to send your Medicaid renewal packet when it is time for you to renew. If you do not renew your eligibility, you will lose your Medicaid benefits.


#### Online tips:

- The fastest way to update contact information is through online chat.
- The fastest way to renew is online by signing in at www.yes.state.nm.us
- If you forgot your username or password, click Forgot User ID or Password and follow the instructions to reset.
- If you have previously signed in to yes.state.nm.us do not click the Create an Account button. This may result in a duplicate account, and you will need to call 1-800-283-4465 to update your account before you can renew online.
- If you do not see a renew button when you sign in at yes.state.nm.us, you will need to call 1-800-283-4465. Your account may need to be updated before you can renew online.

**Important:** If you previously qualified financially for Medicaid, but no longer qualify, or are at risk of losing Medicaid due to a change in financial status, please contact your Medically Fragile RN Case Manager. They can explore options available to maintaining your child's Medicaid.


