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Maintain Medicaid - https://renew.hsd.nm.gov/

In response to the COVID-19 public health emergency, the federal government did not require people to renew their Medicaid or SNAP.

Due to new federal laws and guidelines, everyone will now need to renew their Medicaid and SNAP eligibility when they are notified.

How to renew:

Make sure your contact info is correct. The New Mexico Human Services Department will need your current contact information to send your Medicaid renewal packet when it is time for you to renew. If you do not renew your eligibility, you will lose your Medicaid benefits.

Online tips:

- The fastest way to update contact information is through online chat.
- The fastest way to renew is online by signing in at <u>www.yes.state.nm.us</u>
- If you forgot your username or password, click Forgot User ID or Password and follow the instructions to reset.
- If you have previously signed in to yes.state.nm.us do not click the Create an Account button. This
 may result in a duplicate account, and you will need to call 1-800-283-4465 to update your account
 before you can renew online.
- If you do not see a renew button when you sign in at yes.state.nm.us, you will need to call 1-800-283-4465. Your account may need to be updated before you can renew online.

Important: If you previously qualified financially for Medicaid, but no longer qualify, or are at risk of losing Medicaid due to a change in financial status, please contact your Medically Fragile RN Case Manager. They can explore options available to maintaining your child's Medicaid.

In the event of hospitalization and ER visits, we want to be there to support you.


Please share with your hospital staff that your loved one is on the Medically Fragile Program.

Hi, Nichole Rajala here. I'm here to share some tips on how to get some extra fat and calories into your kiddos diet, for those that need it!

I have 2 kids that require a specialized diet. This was especially challenging to figure out when they were little. It's much easier with my 9 year old now, but I still struggle with my 2 year old. We just got my 2 year old to her minimum BMI goal which has been super exciting!

Here are a few tips we have been given over the years :

Adding Calories & Fat

Use half & half or heavy cream

Many recipes call for milk. Replacing all or part of the milk with half & half or heavy cream can add an impressive caloric boost. Add it to everyday dishes such as oatmeal, cereal, or mashed potatoes.

Avoid 'low fat' and 'fat free' foods


Many foods that are labeled 'low fat' or 'fat free' require added sugar to become palatable. You're better off with the normal versions of such foods. Always choose full fat dairy and salad dressings.

Butter (and salt) your veggies

Buttering vegetables makes them oh so yummy, and increases the calories significantly. Adding salt doesn't increase the calories, but it does make them even tastier; and CF patients need a lot of salt.

There are also powdered additives you can add to your kids formula or pediasures. We use one called DuoCal and it was a game changer adding that to my daughters pediasures this past year! Please talk to your doctor about adding a product like this to your child's diet first!

Governor Lujan Grisham and the 2023 New Mexico Legislature enacted another round of economic relief payments to go to New Mexico residents this year. The bill authorizes two kinds of payment:

** People who file personal income tax returns for tax year 2021 will get the payments automatically. If you're in this group, you don't have to do anything except wait for your rebate to appear, by a direct deposit to your bank account or a check in the mail. The rebates will be \$500 for single filers and \$1,000 for married couples.

** People who didn't file a 2021 income tax return because their income wasn't high enough to require one can request an economic relief payment by going to the Human Services Department's online portal at www.yes.state.nm.us.

* The website will start accepting applications at 9:00 AM on Monday, June 12 and applications must be completed by 5:00 PM on the following Friday, June 23.

* You can claim the payment using either a Social Security Number (SSN) or an Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN).

* The amount of the payment hasn't been decided yet. Payments will be sent out by the end of July.

* The payments will NOT be considered in determining your eligibility for Medicaid or any other program administered by HSD.

* If you fall into this group, be sure to visit the Yes New Mexico website and submit your application as soon as possible.


